

Volunteer Hours Requirements and Recordkeeping

Since the goal is to keep our Master Recycler Composter skills current and have a variety of experiences, volunteer hours should be included in public outreach efforts and demonstration gardens. Veterans need a minimum of 35 hours "Other" hours include educational outreach, monthly MRC meetings, planning meetings for various events, set up and take down for SWW Fair, Home & Garden, GFE, helping with training, etc. Hours earned above the 35-hour minimum are appreciated.

Credit for volunteer hours is given only for projects adopted at the annual meeting each year, except for continuing education hours.

If you have any questions about how to record volunteer hours or what counts as volunteer hours, please check with the MRC Coordinator.

To fill out this form:

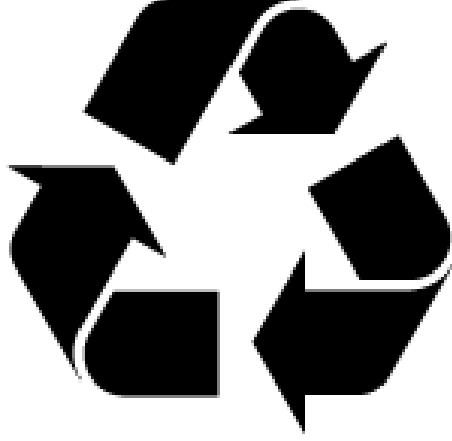
1. Enter the date or range of days for the activity.
