WSU Master Recycler Composter training is provided by WSU Extension faculty, staff and volunteers and other knowledgeable resource people.

The course will cover topics such as the problem of waste in Lewis County, composting, vermiculture, household hazardous waste, garden and yard waste, techniques for reducing household and garden waste, the effects of waste on water quality as well as tools and resources for teaching recycling and composting.

There is a fee of \$50 for materials and costs associated with the training which is due prior to beginning of training. Upon completion of training and the 40 hours of volunteer service, \$25 will be refunded.

By signing this agreement you are agreeing to attend all training sessions and to complete your volunteer commitment as a certified Master Recycler Composter.
